

# Scribble Monster Art

Today we'll be creating scribble  
Monsters so...

Lets get into it!



What we used:

- MAA0011 Mont Marte Sketch Board with clips Large
- MSB0007 Mont Marte Sketch Book A2
- MMKC0061 Mont Marte T-shirt Markers 8 pce
- MMKC0095 Mont Marte Colour Clickers 25 pce

### Step 1. Creating your scribble

Open the packet of Kids Colour T - Shirt Markers and choose a colour. I am using black but you can use what ever colour you like. Start in the corner and create an interesting scribble. There is no set way to do this just keep your movement fairly fluid.



### Step 2. Detailing the scribble

Now the scribble is drawn, look at it for a while and use your imagination to see if any shapes that have been created within your scribble can be changed in to a monster. Like this little fellow, I might call him.... 'Professor Jellybean'.



### Step 3. More detailing

Draw 1 monster at a time and think about creating interesting patterns and techniques. Like with my 'fish monster' here. I'm creating a recurring fish scale patten.



*Because everybody's scribble will be different try to use your own imagination and see what monsters appear inside your scribble. If you need some ideas then have a look at the last page of this PDF for some inspiration.*



Step 4. Adding colour to the monsters  
One can use any medium for the colouring stage, but I think colouring pencils are particularly well suited to this project. So I colour in 'Professor jelly bean' first. The technique I use is to shade the colour darker at the edge. This just creates more interest than a flat colour.



Step 5. Adding more colour  
I'm colouring in the 'Green Man' here and using the darker of the 2 greens in the set for the shadow areas. I use a pink and purple blend for the tongue because I think it looks good next to that green.



*Laying down a coat of colour and then laying another colour over the top is a great way to create intense new colours.*



Step 6. Bringing it altogether  
Although choosing your colours is a personal preference. Try to use primary and secondary colours whenever you can.
